#### 10.1 Antelope Elementary School Principal's Report

Enrollment stands at 403.

Booster Club held their first Mother and Son Rock n' Bowl—they had 145 participants. It was a very positive event.

Winter Assessments are currently taking place. These assessments will be used to measure student growth since the fall assessments.

The Antelope School Accountability Report Card (SARC) has been updated and was approved by the Site Council today. Students completed the School Climate and Safety Survey it was presented to Site Council as well.

Last Friday students participated in a shelter in place drill—it went very well. Keys have been installed in classroom so teachers always have access to a second key to lock their room.

#### 10.2 Berrendos Middle School Principal's Report

Enrollment stands at 230.

Student Surveys were completed in class today online using Chrome Books or student laptops. The surveys focused on school climate. The results were reported to the Site Council. Parent surveys will be next. The results will be reported the Site Council next month.

Berrendos will participate in a shelter in place drill next month. The Safety Summit will be held next month at the Tehama County Department of Education.

Winter Bench Marks have been finished.

Eighth grade students had their first college campus visit last week to Chico State. It went very well—students' behavior was excellent. Planning is underway for UTI and Davis.

#### 10.3 Manton, Plum Valley, Mineral School Principal's Report

Student surveys will be completed next week and parent surveys prior to the next Site Council meeting.

Basketball is in full swing.

Currently we are working on an assessment schedule for Smarter Balanced Assessments and testing the equipment.

The work continues on maintenance issues.

Enrollment is as follows: Manton 46, Plum Valley 19, and Mineral 7.

#### 10.4 Curriculum Report

Currently mid-year assessments are being conducted. Aimes Web and Lets Go Learn are being used to assess students in reading and Lets Go Learn for Math.

The District has a team reviewing two programs—Mastery Content and Measured Progress—these programs help with the sharing common assessment and track the mastery of the assessments.

Currently we are looking at the restructuring of our elementary report card to reflect Common Core.

PLCs are going well.

Planning is underway for Smarter Balanced and CST Science—we are looking at schedules, hardware, and making sure the teachers are ready to administer the tests.

The Solar project is on track with its time line and should finish prior to our February break. Representatives from the project plan to attend the next Board meeting.

The Business department will be looking at developing a maintenance master plan for the future over the next few months.
