10. <u>REPORTS</u>

10.1 Curriculum Report

Teresa Cottier updated the Board on State Testing:

- 1. The testing window opened 4/9/18 and closes 5/25/18
- 2. Testing schedule, binders, and training will be given to teachers prior to testing.

3. This year will be the field test for the new science test - 5th/8th grades only.

4. Training is under way for the paraeducators that will be providing support for students with IEP's and 504's.

A team from Antelope will be going to the History/Social Science Adoption Tool kit training and Publisher's Fair next Monday at TCDE. They will be evaluating the new curricula.

On April 25, 2018 the BMS and LAVA science team will be attending a CAST Academy at TCDE. The CAST Academy offers the participants an opportunity to develop a deeper understanding of the assessment design and expectations of the CAST. It also provides activities to assist in implementing the California Next Generation Science Standards and three-dimensional learning to help participants gain an understanding of how these new science assessment item types can inform teaching and learning.

The LCAP parent survey is posted on the district website. Teresa Cottier asked that everyone spread the word about the LCAP survey.

10.2 Maintenance Operations & Transportation

Over spring break the crew trimmed trees, serviced the refrigerators, and prepped the track. HVAC filters are being changed and any needed repairs are being scheduled along with servicing the yard equipment.

CHP was here today for the annual terminal inspection-just a few minor issues.

10.3 Antelope Elementary School Principal's Report

The annual Rodeo "Cowboy Up" anti-bullying assembly was held today.

Progress reports will go home on Friday, April 20, 2018. State testing will begin soon. Field trip season is starting along with the end of the year rush.

10.4 Berrendos Middle School Principal's Report

Testing will begin at Berrendos on April 30 - May 11, 2018.

Track is underway and Mr. Weber thanked the maintenance staff for their hard work getting the track ready.

a.) Computers & Robotics Class Presentation

LAVA students demonstrated how their Scribbler Robots work. Mrs. Smith, who teaches the afternoon Robotics Lab, explained what a Scribbler Robot is and how it works. Each student independently, through trial and error, works to program their Robot to do a specific task. Students learn how to

write code and test code. Each student demonstrated a different task they had programed their robot to perform.

14. ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION

14.1 Portable Project Update

Superintendent Hassay spoke with Semingson Architects—so far two of the portable have been cleared and they are 98% sure two more will be cleared to house students. They are recommending that the district go out to hard bid rather than the Lease Lease Back this time.

14.2 Manton Apple Festival

Representatives from the Manton Apple Festival questioned the Board on their continued use of the Manton School facilities for their annual festival. Questions also arose on the upkeep of the facility. The Board assured the festival members that they would still be able to use the school facilities and that the district would still be taking care of the grounds. It was brought up that Ishi Conservation Camp could be contacted to help with grounds maintenance prior to the festival.

The Board was asked about the school boundaries in regards to the ball fields and museum and if the school sits on one or more parcels and who owns the parcels. Dan Boone said the Board would go to the county assessor and pull the official maps.

In closing the committee members noted that the closing of Manton School will impact the entire community—the school is critical to the life of the community of Manton. Catherine Mancino added that the school is the hub of the community.

14.3 Manton Education Council Charter School

Matthew Meyer from the Manton Education Council spoke on behalf of the Manton Charter School. They have approached both Evergreen Union Elementary School District and Black Butte Elementary School District to sponsor their charter. Both districts have denied the request for sponsorship. Mr. Meyer requested that the AESD Board consider sponsorship when the charter is finalilzed. Mr. Meyer explained that they are rewriting the charter to span grades K-8 and have removed grades 9-12 from the charter petition.

Superintendent Hassay and the Board are in agreement that the district needs to look for ways to help support the Manton Charter. Bret Richards added that if there was anything he could do personally he is available.
